Dear Friends,

Three years ago, a group of women leaders convened in Colorado to create a new way to propel women to the top of the private sector. The words of Mary Barra and Ginni Rometty still resonate: "The way to make real change is to create accelerators within future generations of women leaders." And JOURNEY was born. By identifying and equipping exceptional mission-driven women to reach the top, JOURNEY enables high-potential leaders to scale their impact, change more lives, and create a multiplier effect that benefits everyone.

The outstanding leaders in our third annual class of Fellows are midway through their year-long program, and our first two classes have completed theirs. By next spring we will have a Fellow community of 100 and growing. These lifelong Members enjoy continued access to our network and the JOURNEY team's coaching on building impact platforms, serving on corporate boards, and making other strides key to strengthening leadership.

Yes, we're proud that so many of these Fellows tell us we're changing their lives. More importantly, we are proud of them. They have ascended into CEO roles, raised major capital, added Fortune 500 companies as customers, expanded their businesses into new global markets, and amplified their thought leadership on critical issues. We stand in awe of their keen vision to tackle the world's most pressing challenges, their boundless talent, and their fierce determination to scale impact.

Nearly everyone who engages with JOURNEY Fellows—the renowned leaders in our Champion community, our board members, our Partners—are inspired by these visionary leaders. And they applaud the progress already being made by JOURNEY's unique and powerful approach to strengthening the top of the leadership pyramid. Champion Roz Brewer says it well: "I want so much for this generation and sometimes I lose hope. JOURNEY's Fellows open my eyes to new possibilities."

JOURNEY's Champions are core to our progress; their collective genius is what makes us unique. These trailblazers have led large companies as Chairs and CEOs; they've built major venture funds and philanthropies. They were among the first women to reach the top—and they refuse to be the last. JOURNEY Co-founder Pattie Sellers spent two decades leading Fortune Most Powerful Women and creating a preeminent global leadership community. I led Fortune MPW's international growth, and now we are leveraging our experience to build JOURNEY to be an even more extraordinary leadership network. We are strategically adding prominent women leaders to our current community of 50 Champions, while bringing in men as Partners via our Circle of Allies. (See list on page 13.)

Our Champions and Partners understand our urgency to scale Journey to Lead, a 501(c)3 nonprofit, and enrich the supply of top leadership talent. The world has entered an especially uncertain and treacherous era—contending with climate change, cyber threats, and yawning inequities related to healthcare, education, and economic mobility. Generative AI portends dramatic progress and massive risks. THE NEED FOR JOURNEY IS NOW



Only 10% of Fortune 500 CEOs are women, and less than 1% are women of color. 2% of VC funding goes to women, and less than 1% to women of color.

C-suite progress is reversing: Women's share of top executive roles (CEO, CFO, and other senior positions) in S&P companies dropped to 11.8% in 2023 from 12.2% in 2022.





The JOURNEY Timeline

The JOURNEY team and our Champions work all year long to select and equip the best women leaders of tomorrow to scale.

January

Application window for the new class of Fellows closes.

JOURNEY convenes Fellows, Champions, and Partners in San Francisco for the annual multi-class event.

February

JOURNEY reviews applications and interviews finalists for the new class of Fellows.

March

Graduating Fellows convene with Champions and Partners at JOURNEY NYC.

JOURNEY announces the new class of 25 Fellows on International Women's Day.

April

JOURNEY Team meets with each of the 25 new Fellows virtually to learn about their goals and challenges and to map their JOURNEY year ahead.

May

The JOURNEY Kickoff Retreat brings together the 25 new Fellows and the Champions for four days of collaboration, coaching, and guiding to scale leadership and impact.

June

Monthly virtual workshops and one-on-one coaching begin for the new Fellows. Topics include leadership storytelling, serving on corporate boards, and presentation training.

Fellows, Members, and Champions gather virtually to share ideas on scaling leadership and impact.

July

JOURNEY continues hosting virtual sessions and conducting one-on-one coaching throughout the summer months.

Regional Pods, which are local groups of Fellows and Champions, convene to share ideas.

August

Application and Nomination window for next year's class of Fellows opens.

September

Fellows gather with Champions, Partners, and government leaders at JOURNEY DC.

October

Fellows and Members meet virtually with JOURNEY Partners who share lessons on scaling leadership.

November

Fellows, Members, and Champions convene virtually for a workshop on raising capital.

December

The JOURNEY team reviews hundreds of applications for the next class of Fellows.
